Tap this button on the home page of the app to bring up the menu you can see here then scroll down to Privacy Shortcuts

These sections should be set to just "Friends" and not "Friends of Friends" for maximum privacy




On the home screen tap the profile photo in the top right hand corner.




Tap on settings and privacy


The options here can be used to control who can send messages to the account along with who can see the tweets sent from it






Instagram

The profile on the bottom right corner will bring up the profile




The 3 vertical dots (or a cog for iPhone) will bring up the settings menu

Private Account can then be turned on to prevent strangers viewing content




Snapchat



Tap on the Snapchat icon to bring up the user profile



Then the red cog for the settings menu



Scroll down to the section called "Who can" and ensure that "My Friends" is selected for both.
Content can easily be erased off the device further down this menu under Account Actions
