#### Headteacher's Introduction

Dear Parents and Carers,

It is hard to believe that we are already at the end of September and that when we return to school on Monday, after the weekend, we will be into October already. The weeks really are flying by.

I am sure you are aware that we have continued to 'raise the bar' in our standards and expectations of students as we have returned from the Summer. We are very clear about 'holding the line' with students and making sure that we follow through with the required action in line with our new systems and procedures. The response from our students has, in the main, been excellent. Removals from lessons have reduced from (on average) 14 per day last year, to just 4 per day. The number of lates to school and to lessons are also falling. Some students will begin to hit the next threshold for 5+ removals and lates very soon, which will lead to more serious sanctions.








## **Homework in English**

We are moving to Microsoft Forms for most of the homework in English this year. To use it, students must be log onto their school email account beforehand. They both run off the same system.



We have moved to this system to save on paper and avoid students panicking about missing sheets or booklets. All the work will now be collected electronically. Of course, the teacher might set the occasional homework differently.

Also, we would like to remind parents and carers that all students are expected to read for at least fifteen minutes a day, regardless of their age. Reading is vital to success in all subjects. A student who reads regularly at home is a student who succeeds in their GCSEs.

### **Attendance**

Good attendance at school is not just valuable, it's essential. Going to school is directly linked to improved exam performance which should in turn lead to further learning opportunities and better job prospects. As well as this, going to school helps to develop:

- Friendships
  - Social skills
  - Team values
  - Life skills
  - Cultural awareness
  - Career pathways

#### Absence from school

All schools must record details of students' attendance and absence at school. They do this at the beginning of morning and afternoon sessions meaning that each day your child receives two half day marks.

If your child is going to be absent from school, (e.g. for an unavoidable appointment) then you should let the school know as soon as possible. If your child has been absent due to an unexpected event such as bereavement or illness then you must also let the school know on the first day of absence in line with the school's attendance policy. The school will then record the absence. If you fail to tell the school as to why your child has not been present then the school may record that period of absence as being unauthorised.

#### **Holidays During Term Time**

Please be aware that holidays during term time are not to be taken and it is extremely unlikely that they will be authorised. In many cases, when a holiday has been taken, the school will request that a fixed penalty notice will be issued by the local authority, which results in an additional fine. The school does have the right to challenge parents if there is evidence that a holiday has been taken. For example, if we try to call and we receive an international dialling tone.

We give you thanks, Lord for calling us to serve you. Strengthen our loyalty and keep us faithful to you, so that we may enjoy your friendship forever. Amen.








#### **Chaplaincy:**
