


The students in the photograph were the top 10 students in Year 7 with the most number of positive points.

Police drop in sessions

You may notice a police vehicle outside of school occasionally or your child may come home saying that officers have been at school. This is an initiative to build bridges between students and the police. Members of the Safer neighbourhood Team from Ilkeston Police Station will be conducting regular informal drop in sessions to enable students to meet them, ask for advice, pass on any confidential concerns and for officers to get to know your children with a view of improving relationships and safeguarding. Many young people either hate the police or fear them and don't feel confident in reporting things or asking for advice so these informal sessions are a way to reduce that.

The Safer Neighbourhood team will also be popping in during some PSHE lessons for more targeted sessions and focus groups to help students understand the consequences of certain behaviours and how to protect themselves.

The SJH Big Poppy Knit

Calling all knitters!

Please can you knit some poppies for our November display in SJH? Please give your poppies to SJH Reception for the attention of Rachel.

The SJH Big Poppy Knit – knitted Poppy.

- For the best finish knit with Double Knit (DK yarn). The size of the needle you choose will determine how big the poppy will be, but we recommend 3.75mm(UK9).
- Easy garter/knit stitch pattern for beginners.
- Colour A Red (one ball will make a lot of poppies) you may want to make a white, purple poppy, all will be included in the display.
- Colour B An end of black yarn or a black button
- Body of Poppy
- Using colour A cast on 120 stitches.
- Rows 1-4 Knit
- Row 5 knit 3 stitches together across the row (40 stitches)
- Row 6-9 Knit
- Row 10 Knit 2 stitches together across the row (20 stitches)
- Rows 11-14 knit
- Row 15 Knit 2 stitches together across the row (10 stitches).
- Cut yarn leaving a tail of about 20cm
- Thread tail through yarn needle and slip all the remaining live stitches onto the yarn tail
- and pull tight. Pull around into a circle and then mattress stitch (or use whatever stitching you would normally use) to seam for an invisible seam. Sew in ends.
- Centre of poppy.
- Using B cast on 16 sts. Cast off. Coil into a tight spiral and sew base to the centre. Or use a black or green button with 4 holes and sew to centre of poppy.
