The Bennerley Viaduct, Cossall mine, Stanton Iron works, Roundhouse and railways will feature at a local level to give us a sense of our local identity.





We will begin year 8 with a bridge unit between the medieval and the Renaissance which is very relevant to our school context. We will try to understand the changes made during the Reformation.
