Overview

Parents/carers will be given assessment data relating to their son/daughter's progress at regular intervals throughout the academic year.

For Key Stage 3 (Years 7, 8 and 9)

Snapshot reports will contain a learning review grade linked to progress, and a set of attitude to learning grades.

For Key Stage 4 (Years 10 and 11)

Snapshot reports will contain a target and predicted End of Key Stage 4 grade, and a set of attitude to learning grades.



Attitude to Learning Grades

There are 4 attitude to learning categories...

- *Punctual and ready to learn*
- *Remains focusses and engaged in the lesson*
- *Shows respect to staff and students*
- *Completes Homework*

For each category, teachers can choose from...

- *Always*
- *Most of the time*
- *Occasionally*
- *Seldom/Never*



Key Stage 3 Progress Grades

Students will be given a progress grade linked to the following progress statements...

- **STRONG:** Successfully learning all or nearly all the curriculum, demonstrating a strong understanding of the knowledge and skills expected.
- **GOOD:** Successfully learning most of the curriculum, demonstrating a good understanding of the knowledge and skills expected, although there may be some gaps.
- **DEVELOPING:** Successfully learning some of the curriculum, demonstrating a satisfactory understanding of the knowledge and skills expected, although there may be a number of gaps.
- **EMERGING:** Not successfully learning the curriculum, with significant gaps in the skills and knowledge expected.



Key Stage 3 Progress Grades

We collect progress grade three times a year. These are called our 'learning review points'. In Key Stage 3, teachers will make a holistic judgement about each students progress and record it in Go 4 Schools.

The progress grade is made available to parents/carers, along with the 'attitude to learning' data as a printed report. It is also accessible in Go 4 Schools.

Included in one of these reports to parent/carers is a written report from each subject teacher.



Key Stage 4 Target and Predicted Grades

From Year 10 students begin their GCSE course, and their target/predicted grades relate to the GCSE outcomes at the end of Year 11.

KS4 Target Grade: This is grade the student should aspire to achieving at the end of Year 11. Individual targets are calculated based on a range of information including the student's prior attainment, national results and relevant in-school assessments.

KS4 Predicted Grade: Teachers update predictions regularly throughout the year. The current prediction is what the teacher thinks the student may achieve in their final GCSE grade taking into account their work and assessments so far.



Key Stage 4 Target and Predicted Grades

The predicted grade is made available to parents/carers, along with the 'attitude to learning' data as a printed snapshot report. It is also accessible in Go 4 Schools.

One snapshot report to parent/carers will also contain written comments from each subject teacher.
