Year 7s – Villains

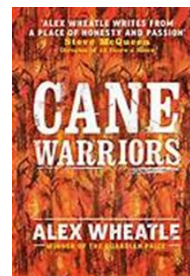

Year 9 – Novel

Year 9 have started their work on comparing two novels. Over the next two terms, students study John Steinbeck's 'Of Mice and Men' and Alex Wheatle's 'Cane Warriors'. Students are exploring symbolism within the books and how they reflect the idea and themes of the time they were set and written in.

Year 10 – GCSE Paper 1 and Poetry

Students have studied five poems in the Power and Conflict Anthology. They include 'The Charge of the Light Brigade', 'Exposure', 'Bayonet Charge' and 'Remains'. Alongside these poems, students have been exploring other poets and seeing how they treat war differently.

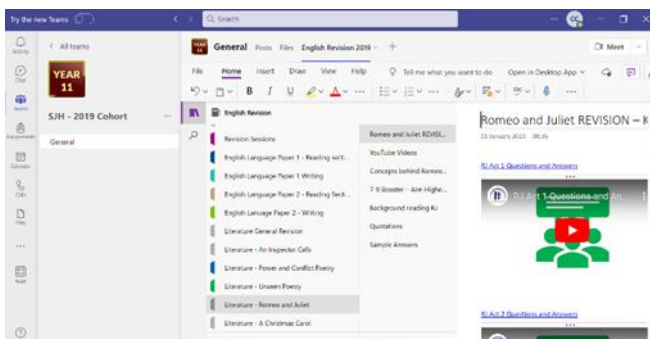
One student introduced Edward Thomas' Rain to the class:

Year 11 – GCSE Exams

We have started preparations for the GCSE exams. So far 88 different students have attended our online revision session this term. Our revision sessions take place each Tuesday and Year 11 students will find the link on their Teams calendar.

Please direct your son or daughter to the dedicated English revision section on Teams. We place all past papers and revision materials on Teams so students can access them from home at time... and anywhere if needs be.



Reading and Reading Logs

Nationally, there is a trend of students reading fewer books as they get older. The trend starts, usually, in Year 5 and we see this continue in secondary school. We want, as a school, to promote reading so therefore we use the reading logs to track reading and to identify and flag up students who need to read more for pleasure.



All GCSE exams rely on a student's ability to read correctly, and students have a greater chance of making fewer mistakes if they read on a regular basis. A student who reads is a student who succeeds.

Students should be reading for 20 minutes a day as part of their regular homework. We'd be grateful if you helped promote reading at home and helped build reading into the routines at home.

Poetry By Heart Competition

For all years, we are running a poetry reading competition. The competition is simple. Students learn a poem and then read it aloud. The best performances are sent off to see if we, as a school, can compete nationally at the Globe theatre in London.

Pathways to Medicine

Pathways to Medicine is an exciting new initiative delivered at the University of Nottingham in partnership with the Sutton Trust.

This free programme is aimed at students who are interested in studying a medicine degree and following a career in the medical profession.

Running over a two-year period, the programme provides ongoing support and guidance through:

- medicine-related tasters, lectures and masterclasses
- an undergraduate medicine e-mentor
- advice and guidance sessions on UCAS, UCAT, careers and employability
- a residential summer school
- a supported work placement

All sessions will take place online or at the University of Nottingham.

Pathways to Medicine is an outstanding opportunity to enhance your university application.

Who should apply?
All applicants **must**:

- be starting year 12 in a state school/college in September 2023
- live within reasonable commuting distance of Nottingham
- be studying three or more A levels, including Biology and Chemistry
- Have achieved at least five GCSEs at Level 6 (B), including Maths, English Language, Chemistry and Biology (or double science)

There are additional eligibility criteria outlined on the Sutton Trust website.

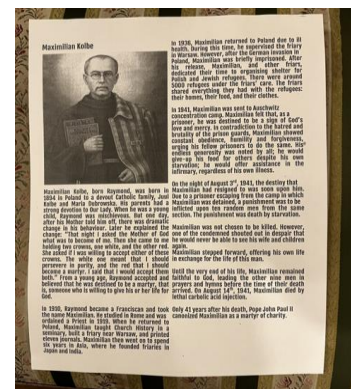
