Meetings with staff:

The constraints on school resources make it essential that parents and carers use authorised school procedures to avoid diverting time and attention that must be invested directly in students' learning and wellbeing. We ask that any meeting requests with members of staff are pre-booked and agreed in advance. Parents are kindly requested not to turn up at the school unannounced as a meeting may not be possible without making an appointment. In the first instance, a call to the school office would be much more effective in ensuring that an issue is dealt with as quickly as possible. Members of staff are not expected to change their calendars to accommodate a parent who demands a meeting without prior agreement. Parents are politely reminded that all teachers in school have a timetable of lessons and their days are often planned in advance.

Derbyshire County Council Household Support Fund:

As part of the Department for Work and Pensions' Household Support Fund Scheme, Derbyshire County Council is distributing funding to household's struggling to pay for food, energy and essential living costs.

As part of the scheme, the Council will again be distributing grocery vouchers to low-income families. Information about who is eligible for the vouchers is available on the website and they hope to start distribution in early January 2024. They will update the website when all vouchers have been distributed and provide details of what parents and carers should do if they haven't received their voucher.

Theology & Religious Studies Department News

Year 7 - Theology:

The Advent term saw the beginning of the new Year 7 Theology course. Year 7 are the first year group to study Theology – The Ology! From September this year, all Catholic primary and secondary schools throughout England began a new programme of study called "To Know You More Clearly." For secondary schools, this is the first time that all schools have had the same programme of study. It is academically challenging and prepares students well for the GCSE courses in Religious Studies that they will eventually study. We called the subject Theology because of its precisely focussed and academically challenging content. We have been delighted to see Year 7 working so well to get to grips with this subject! They are confident with words such as omnipotent, transcendent, eternal and imminent. And they should be able to tell you what a literary form is! We have also invested in Kerboodle which includes access for all Year 7 students to the source and summit textbook online – this is accessed via the student homepage.








Year 8 – Luke's gospel:

This term, year 8 have been focussing on Luke's Gospel. Every student in Year 8 received a copy of the Gospel and students have been learning how to read the text of the bible through different lenses: background to the text, the events taking place in the text and what it means for us as Christians today. They've also had a reading log to help them to read through the whole gospel in a structured manner and to develop reading and interpretation skills.









Theology & Religious Studies Department News

Year 9 – Philosophers:

Year 9 began their year with a study of the philosophy of religion. They studied different arguments for the existence of God – for example the Cosmological and teleological arguments put forward by people such as St Thomas Aquinas. They have also considered reasons why people argue that God cannot be proven and reasons why some people suggest that evil in the world suggests there is no God. They are now onto the topic of Religion, Peace and Conflict which involves them in questions such as: Can WMD ever be justified? What are the rules of war? Should Christians always be pacifists?

In the Lent term, we will be moving on to religion, relationships and families and using some of the Ten Ten RSE resources to support our learning.

GCSE Religious Studies: EDUQAS Route B Catholic Christianity and Judaism Knowledge Books And Revision Books:

All students in Year 10 and 11 receive knowledge books for each unit of the course to support learning at home. In addition, Year 11 receive guided revision activity booklets to support reteach and revision.

Year 10 — will receive a new homework calendar for Lent 1 term. This will be a combination of carousel learning quizzes and 'yellow sheet exam practice' questions on alternate weeks. **Year 11** — are well on course for completing their GCSE syllabus in good time! The RE team are planning a new structure for reteach and revision in advance of the next mock exams and final GCSE.

Christmas cards for our school neighbours:

Every year, we invite a group of students to make Christmas cards for our neighbours on Abbott Road. We see this as part of our mission as a Catholic community, but also because we know our neighbours are faced with heavy traffic twice a day – both on foot, in cars and the buses. This year, we asked Year 7 to make the cards and they will be delivered by some of our Year 7 students.

Farewell to Mrs Ryan!

We will be saying farewell to Mrs Ryan at the end of the advent term. Mrs Ryan joined us from New Zealand in 2017 and she and her family will be returning there during the Christmas break, where Mrs Ryan will take up a new RE post in her old school. We would like to thank her for all her hard work and contribution over the years and wish her every joy and blessing for the future.

We know Fr Paul was very pleased to have SJH staff and pupils present. Such a wonderful evening and our prayers are with Canon Paul.


















Chaplaincy:

Reconciliation and Conversation in Advent:


