School uniform socks must be black, white socks are not permitted. White sports socks may only be worn for PE lessons.









Maths Department News

Our students have been getting stuck in with some great Maths over the last 10 weeks. Let's delve further into what they've been doing...

Year 7

The enthusiasm that Year 7 students have displayed since arriving at SJH has been wonderful! Students began the year working on negative numbers, before moving on to explore decimals in detail. Since then, students have dived into special numbers, such as triangular and prime numbers, and then began learning the 'language of algebra'. We've spent many hours 'translating' from English to algebra with great effect!





Year 8

Year 8 have done some hugely practical Maths so far this year. Beginning with standard form, and seeing how we can write very large, and very small numbers, students have since gone on to explore rounding, estimation and errors. Since, students have looked at ways we can display data and work out averages – extremely helpful for the 'real-world'.

Year 9

Year 9 continue their GCSE preparation with algebra heavy topics, including simultaneous equations, re-arranging formulas and graphing work. Soon, students will be looking at proportion and then trigonometry once more, as we continue to get our students ready to smash their GCSE's.









Year 10

Our foundation students in Year 10 have been revisiting their knowledge of number, including order of operations, use of a calculator and indices, as well as more recently reviewing linear graphs and types of sequence. Higher students have started the year with brand new topics, including surds and rationalising denominators.



Year 11

Year 11 continue their preparation for summer exams. Teaching continues to vary based upon the requirements of students and the class more generally, whilst homework continues to be past papers. These papers are crucial to help get students exam ready! We are enjoying seeing our Year 11 students afterschool on Monday's for their extra revision sessions, which are proving extremely helpful. We also have some students completing their Further Maths qualification. Well done to everyone who is staying after school!

Francesca M in year 11 has been nominated by staff for this week's St John Houghton Award, she has been nominated for her dedication to her studies and determination to succeed.




