Reading at Saint John Houghton CVA



At SJH we firmly believe that 'A student who reads is a student who succeeds'. It is well evidenced that students who read regularly can increase their ability to achieve one GCSE grade higher than students who do not read regularly.

Reading increases student vocabulary, increases student understanding of people and place and improves the students' ability to infer meaning beyond the written word.

To support our students, we ask that they read regularly in tutor time. To help us in this activity we would like students to bring in a book every day to school. Many students do bring in a reading book from home however, a significant number do not. This lack of reading material can make it hard for students to join in with their peers when they are all reading and also means that they never become fully engaged in a text. Any type of book is good! Fiction or non-fiction can be brought into school.

We are happy to help any student who may struggle with this request as we have a well-stocked mini fiction library where books can be borrowed. If this would help please ask your child to talk to their tutor or you could contact school directly through schooloffice@sjh.srscmat.co.uk. Termly reading recommendations are available on the school website and useful ideas for age appropriate books can also be found.






Chaplaincy:
