Water bottles:


As the weather becomes warmer, please ensure students have a water bottle with them in school, there are several water refill points around school.


Erewash Community Update – April 2024




Chaplaincy:

I am delighted to announce our Guest Speaker for our next Friends of SJH Coffee Morning on Friday 26 April 2024 at 11.30am will be: Maria Kirk.

When The Repair Shop began the new series on TV a few months ago, Maria Kirk, a parishioner of Our Lady of Good Counsel Church in Eastwood, arrived at "the barn" with a painting in a very damaged state; as the story unfolded, the damage was explained

The Madonna and Child dates back to the 1890s and belonged to a Ukrainian Catholic priest, Father Joseph Bilinski, who was Maria's grandfather. The painting had been given to Fr Joseph by his father, who was also a priest, on the occasion of his ordination. It hung in Fr Joseph's parish Church, located in a small village in western Ukraine. Fr Joseph, his wife Halyna, and their children (Stefania, Roman, and Irena, who was Maria's mother), managed to survive the first world war and enforced famine. Fr Joseph died before the start of WWII, and as the war came closer the family decided to flee to Poland in order to escape the Russian army; before they left their home they took one special item with them.

Maria is bringing her famous picture to SJH and staff and students will have the opportunity to chat to Maria and hear her wonderful story. Please let us know if you will be joining us. If you are at work or cannot attend the 26th then please know Maria will be at the Beauvale Pilgrimage on May 5th 2024 with her picture.

Optional walking pilgrimage with Mass at Beauvale Priory The pilgrimage will begin gathered around the Beauvale stone near the ruins to pray the Beauvale Martyrs prayer at 3.30pm

Sunday 5th May 2024 3.30PM

Beauvale Priory, Beauvale Abbey Farm, New Road, Moorgreen NG16 2AA

There has been a regular pilgrimage to the ruins of Priory since the 1936, for many years people walked the "Holy Mile" either from Our Lady's Church at Eastwood, or from the bottom of the lane, reciting the rosary. In 1976 together with a few others Miss Pat Miller and her mother, began the Beauvale Society to promote the history of the martyr saints, and the society is still in existence. What do people say about this pilgrimage? "I love this pilgrimage it is wonderful to gather with people of different ages at this holy site where you can feel the prayers of those who have worshipped God here for centuries"

History of Beauvale Priory

In 1343 a Carthusian Priory was dedicated here set in the countryside of Nottinghamshire known as 'the Beautiful Vale'. Here they lived a silent life of prayer and work for 200 years until the dissolution of the Monasteries, when they refused to sign the oath of Supremacy. The two Priors Ss John Houghton and Robert Lawrence were sentenced to death by being hung, drawn and quartered, they became the first two martyrs of the reformation and were declared saints In 1970.

Come along to CAFOD Club Monday 12.45pm - 1.05pm HU3 and join these amazing students in our next project.


I am delighted when students knock on my door at break time and ask me to support them with a visit to a home for the elderly.
