Our Year 7s have been working on the Romantic poets and reading range of poems included Byron, Blake, Wordsworth and others.


Here are two drafts of poems inspired by the William Blake's 'The Tyger'. Students were exploring God's design of a creature.










News from the English Department



Final Details for Beauvale Pilgrimage 2024.


Date: Sunday 5th May 2024
