Thank you to Lucy and Sash for representing SJH this weekend at the Walsingham Pilgrimage. I am delighted you have completed your silver Faith in Action Award.




Please note the change of detail...

Faith in Action


I am delighted that so many pupils have kept me busy by completing their Faith in Action Award!


Grace R in year 7 has been nominated by staff for this week's St John Houghton Award, she has been nominated for her determination to succeed and respect she shows to others.
