- Students homework is set weekly on a Wednesday, due in for the following Tuesday or Wednesday depending on whether they have a lesson that day
- Homework will be to complete an AQA Topic test and 30 minutes Independent learning on <u>https://sparxmaths.com/</u>

Year 11

- Students should complete one page of their "Focus" booklet per week, this will be set on a Wednesday due in for the following Wednesday. Students who would like help with their homework should stay after school on Monday for Maths Clinic in M1/M2.






### **Chaplaincy:**




#### Action:


