Number 11 bus fare increase:

We have been informed that the bus fare for the number 11 bus shared with Kirk Hallam Academy will be increased to £1.50 per journey from Monday 4th November 2024.

<u>Arbor:</u>

Your child should have received instructions on how to access Arbor. They will need to access Arbor to view their homework.

If your child can successfully log into Arbor, please ignore this message.

If your child has not yet been able to login to Arbor, please ask them to follow the instructions below.

Please note, there is no student Arbor App, so they will need to log into Arbor using a normal web browser such as Google Chrome or MS Edge.

Go to https://login.arbor.sc

Click Forgot your password

Enter your school email address and click **Reset Password**.

Log into your school email and then follow the instructions on the email. (Students can login to their email using <u>Microsoft 365 email</u> - If they are unable to login to their email, they need to speak to their form tutor).

Once you have set your password, you need to use your school email address and the new password to login to <u>Arbor</u>.

If they are still not able to login, please ask them to speak to their form tutor or the school office.

Arbor update – Homework:

As we introduce Arbor to the student body we are beginning to set homework on the platform. In Arbor all Homework tasks are called 'Assignments'. Teaching staff are also asking students to write any homework into their Student Diary to support those who have not logged into Arbor yet.

Currently, most Homework set on Arbor allows the teacher to manually mark when a student submits a task. Until the Teacher has marked the homework as being submitted, it will still show as outstanding on the student and parent/carer Arbor information page.

All staff are working hard to learn the new systems that Arbor has. No student will be sanctioned for outstanding homework, that may still be showing on Arbor, when their teacher knows that they have submitted the work.

Attendance update:

Penalty Notice Fines for School Attendance are Changing!

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following changes will come into force for Penalty Notice Fines issued after 19th August 2024.

Per Parent, Per Child

Penalty Notice Fines will now be issued to each parent, for each child that was absent.

For example: 3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent receiving 3 separate fines.

First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days. Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

5 consecutive days of term time leave

Penalty Notice Fines will be issued for Term Time Leave of 5 or more consecutive days. Inset training days are school days and can be included in the 5 or more consecutive days where there was intent to be absent for term time leave.

10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period

Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10 week period.

Second Offence

(within 3 years)

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)

The third time an offence is committed for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court. Magistrates' fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child.

Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on the parent's future DBS certificate, due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.

Can my child take a holiday in term time?

The simple answer is NO – pupils can only take leave of absence during term time if this is approved in advance by the school. Leave taken without permission may result in a penalty notice and or prosecution.



The Law and School Attendance:

In September 2013 the government introduced new regulations making it clear that Headteachers must not give approval for any leave of absence during term time, including holidays, unless there are exceptional circumstances.

Any requests for term time leave should be made on a Request for Leave form available from the school office and handed in at least 12 days before the first date of the requested absence whenever possible. You must have received written authorisation before your child can be absent from school.

Parent/carers may be issued with a penalty notice fine or prosecution should leave of 5 days or more be taken which is not authorised by the Headteacher, or where repeated incidents of leave in term time for less than 5 days occur or where the unauthorised absence contributes to wider poor attendance that meets the legal threshold. Absence deemed for the reason of unauthorised leave in term time will be marked in the register with the Attendance code G.

Absence during Term Time

The Headteacher will only grant an **exceptional leave of absence** to a pupil during term time if the request meets the specific circumstances.

The school considers each application for term-time absence individually, taking into account the specific facts, circumstances and relevant background context behind the request.

Matters **NOT** considered 'exceptional circumstances' include:

- The family cannot afford to go on holiday in school holiday time, or have a special holiday offer for term time.
- To visit family members abroad (unless they are severely ill which may be considered).
- To spend time with a family member who is visiting from abroad in term time.
- Because you or your partner cannot get time off work during school holiday time.
- You have a family tradition of going at a certain time of year.
- Going away for a birthday celebration (including the child's birthday)

Home visits where pupils don't attend school

When a pupil is absent from school, and no reason for absence is received, the school will contact parents/carers by text message or phone call. In the event we are unable to make contact regarding the absence, the school may try other contacts held on a child's record and/or reserve the right to make an unannounced home visit.

Penalty Notices

Leave of absence that has not been approved will therefore be unauthorised and may lead to a referral being made to the Local Authority for action. If unpaid this could lead to prosecution under section 444(1) of The Education Act 1996

You can collect an envelope, make a list of names and return it to SJH or Rachel to take to the parish and these will be placed on the altar throughout November. Nine Masses will be celebrated for all the names included in the envelopes across the three churches. If you would like to enclose a donation for the Masses, please do so, but this is really about celebrating the lives of those we have loved.

November Memorial Candles: Memorial candles will be available form Rachel priced at £2.00 cash please, together with a prayer sheet that can be used to remember those of our loves ones who have died. These candles can be placed on graves, memorial gardens or simply lit at home. Say the prayer on the sheet with family and friends, adding the names of those you would like to remember.

In school retreat:

During the month of November we honour and remember our dead friends and relatives. Here in Saint John Houghton we offer a morning retreat on Thursday 21st November for the students who have lost a parent through death. I will run this retreat in school and it will not be a sad morning or a morning of sharing personal stories; it is an opportunity for the staff to say to your child, "We know, we have not forgotten and we care. We cannot talk to you every day about the death of your parent but we can show you how much we care by offering this morning retreat".

The retreat will end with lunch, provided by school and then your child will be expected to return to afternoon lessons, however, if you feel they could do with time in the afternoon I am happy to support them for the whole day.
