Nut Allergies:

We have several students within school who have severe nut allergies. We aim to be a nut free school and kindly remind parents/carers and students that nuts and food containing nuts must not be brought into school.

Christmas dinner – Wednesday 18 December 2024:

Christmas dinner will be on Wednesday 18 December 2024. There will be no breakfast bar available. Only Christmas dinner will be served on this day, no other lunchtime food will be available. If students do not want a Christmas dinner, they will need to bring a packed lunch.

Early Closure – Friday 20 December 2024:

School will be closing at 2.15pm on the last day of term, the school buses will collect students at 2.15pm. The number 11 bus will not be running that week.

Lunchtime food – Friday 20 December 2024:

There will be a limited range of breakfast bar food available in the morning. The following food will be available at lunchtime - Cheese Paninis, Cheese & Tomato pizza & Pasta pots (tomato &/or cheese). There will be NO fish and chips served or cold sandwiches.

Non uniform day – Friday 20 December 2024:

Students will be able to come to school in non uniform , preferably with a Christmas theme on the last day of term. We are asking for a voluntary contribution towards the school charities. Please ensure students dress appropriately for the weather conditions.

Number 11 bus users:

Kirk Hallam Community Academy are closed Monday 16 to Friday 20 December 2024, therefore the number 11 bus will not be running that week, parents/carers will need to make alternative travel arrangements, apologies for any inconvenience caused.



Derbyshire County Council Household Support Fund:

As part of the Department for Work and Pensions' Household Support Fund Scheme, Derbyshire County Council is distributing funding to household's struggling to pay for food, energy and essential living costs. As part of the scheme, the Council will again be distributing grocery vouchers to low-income families. Information about who is eligible for the vouchers is available on the website and we hope to start distribution in early January 2025. Derbyshire County Council will update the website when all vouchers have been distributed and provide details of what parents and carers should do if they haven't received their voucher. Safeguarding news:

Supporting Children Through Bereavement - Place2Be

When someone close to you dies, it can be a difficult process. For adults this process, whilst painful, can be digested by using the mechanisms we all develop through our early years. That first experience with bereavement, is a necessary but undeniably painful experience which will produce resilient adults. However, it is a process that must be dealt with delicately. For pupils the first death will likely be a grandparent, or an uncle. Individuals that usually have played an immense role in the formative years of that child or young person. Since the processing of death is an intensely private thing for adults, it may not be obvious how to support someone experiencing it for the first time. 
