Safeguarding news:

A Note on Dangerous Gifts - Child Accident Prevention Trust:

December is on the horizon. Families around the country are already putting up Christmas trees and tinsel is starting to grace our high streets. Before long mince pies, Mariah Carey and mysteriously familiar Santa Clauses will make their way into our lives. This is all in good fun, and children from Lands End to John O'Groats look forward to the build up to Christmas all year. However, not all presents are created equally. More than ever our Christmas shopping is done online from an increasingly varied list of providers. From imitation manufacturers, to sellers platforms like Etsy and to third party small businesses that use known provider logistics services, we're all trusting people ever further removed from us to provide high quality goods. Unfortunately this is far from guaranteed. Production firms abroad or within a 'cottage industry' may not have the strict manufacturing standards applied in the UK, or expected as industry standard. Action For Children - Support for Young Carers:

What is a young carer?

A young carer is someone 18 years old or under who helps look after a relative with a disability, illness, mental health condition, or drug or alcohol problem. This could be a parent or a sibling. Some children begin giving care from a very young age, and others become carers overnight

How many young carers are there in the UK?

- Research shows that as many as one in five children and young people are young carers.
- There are around <u>800,000 young carers</u> aged 11-16 in England alone.
- There are an estimated <u>1 million young carers</u> across the UK when accounting for the numbers in Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland.

What do young carers do?

The responsibility of a young carer is wide and varied. It can include:

- Practical tasks, such as cooking, housework and shopping.
- Physical care, like helping someone out of bed.
- Emotional support, including talking to someone who is distressed.
- Personal care, such as helping someone dress.
- Managing the family budget and collecting prescriptions.
- Helping to give medicine.
- Helping someone communicate.
- Looking after brothers and sisters.



Safeguarding news continued:

What support does Action for Children provide young carers?

At Action for Children we do our best to <u>support young carers</u>. We want to make sure they have happy and safe childhoods.

We help nearly 3,700 children and young people who are young carers across the UK, giving them advice and respite through short breaks, activities, and the chance to connect with other young people like them.

We offer practical and emotional support to ensure they are able to enjoy their childhood. We understand being a young carer can be very hard. That's why we're here to make things a little easier. We provide them with a chance to learn and have fun, helping them balance their caring responsibilities with being a child.

Sidekick

Sidekick is an anonymous and confidential text service for young carers. It offers a chance for young carers to talk, have their questions answered or chat about worries and concerns. Young carers can text the service at any time and the team will find the answer and send a reply within 24 hours. With many hidden young carers across the UK, Sidekick is how Action for Children is bridging the gap. 
