Student Council trip to the Houses of Parliament and meeting with Erewash MP:

A very early start in sub-zero temperatures saw 32 year 7-10 students and 3 staff members set off London bound by coach.

4 hours later we arrived at the Houses of Parliament. After passing airport style security, handing in phones, and being given audio packs we set off on our tour. Such a grand and foreboding building steeped in history was fascinating to see with its many stained glass windows, huge statues and great halls. Some of the students were hoping to see the Prime Minister or other famous politicians but alas it was not the day for Prime Ministers questions and so not to be.

This did not dampen the enthusiasm of the students as they fired lots of questions at our tour guide. The highlight of the tour had to be sitting in the public galleries of both the House of Commons with its green seats and the very grand House of Lords with its plush red seats and golden throne. In the galleries we got the opportunity to listen to questions being asked of cabinet ministers covering topics including transport, flooding and rugby union in Cornwall.

After the tour there was a workshop where the students learned about petitions, how and why they are created and how they are the starting point to getting a campaign for change off the ground. A surprise visitor — Adam Thompson MP for Erewash - arrived just in time to hear the students pitch their ideas for a petition. All too quickly it was time to get back on the coach to make the long journey back home to Kirk Hallam. A great day was had by all and the staff were really impressed by the knowledge, curiosity and engagement of the students.

The next day Adam visited the students in school and they hosted their own 'question time,' raising lots of issues such as the lack of pitches for grass-roots girls football, road safety outside school and the environment. We definitely have some budding MPs in our midst. Look out for petitions and campaigns coming soon!
