#### **Year 11 GCSE Exams:**

As we are now well underway with the GCSE exams, we would like to thank all parents/Cares for supporting their students during this stressful period. Please could we remind you that:

- The in-school booster timetable is available on the school website: https://www.stjohnhoughtonilkeston.srscmat.co.uk/curriculum/gcse-exams/
- Please could all parents check with their child that they have a black pen, pencil and calculator (if required) we are already lending out a large amount of stationary at the start of exams.
- School uniform remains the same through ALL exams including the guidance on jewellery.
- Unfortunately, before half term, we cannot authorise student absence for home study - if this is the reason for a Year 11 students' absence from school it will be recorded as unauthorised.
- Study leave begins for all students after the English Exam on Friday 23rd May after this date, students need only come to school for an exam. However, there
  will always be a quiet supervised study space available in school, until the end of
  the exams.
- Students will be permitted to leave school after the English Exam has finished on Fri 23rd May at approx. 11.30am, providing they complete a signing out sheet. Any students who wish to remain in school and/or need to use the school bus to get home, can stay in school and use the quiet study rooms in school.

It was a huge success, and he spent a lot of time talking to all the sponsors and MPs.














#### **Month of Mary Celebrations:**
