Nut Allergies:

We have several students within school who have severe nut allergies. We aim to be a nut free school and kindly remind parents/carers and students that nuts and food containing nuts must not be brought into school.

All students are participating in 2 activities during their allotted time. All students delivered an exceptional performance and demonstrated excellence in their chosen events. There were six school competing in the competition and here is an overview of the day's achievements:

Wilson Award Best New Record trophy for breaking two records on the day in 300m (45.10 seconds) and Javelin (28.91m).

Just recently, Summer has also achieved UK U13's No.1 Long Jump with 5.01m.

The UKMT Challenge is a nationally recognised competition designed to stimulate mathematical thinking and problemsolving among students across the UK. It encourages participants to tackle intriguing and challenging questions that go beyond the standard curriculum, testing their logic, creativity, and reasoning skills.

Taking part in this challenge is a fantastic opportunity for students to stretch their abilities and gain recognition for their mathematical talent. We're incredibly proud of all those who participated and those who gained a gold, silver or bronze certificate were awarded these in their Student Briefing.

By tailoring questions to each student's ability and tracking their progress, Sparx ensures that every learner is challenged appropriately and supported in their journey to mathematical confidence.

To keep students motivated, Sparx awards XP points for every correct answer, encouraging consistent effort and rewarding progress. Each week, students work towards their personalised goals, and those who have earnt the most XP in their year group are recognised for their dedication with a certificate and badge. Level 2 Further Maths GCSE

This year, a group of our highest achieving mathematicians in Year 11 have taken on the challenge of studying Level 2 Further Mathematics GCSE—an advanced qualification designed to extend and deepen students' understanding beyond the standard GCSE curriculum. This course introduces more complex topics such as matrices, calculus, and advanced algebra, providing an excellent foundation for those considering A-level Mathematics or Further Mathematics.

Studying Further Maths not only strengthens problem-solving and analytical thinking, but also builds confidence in tackling unfamiliar and demanding material. It's particularly beneficial for students aiming for top grades, competitive sixth form placements, or future careers in STEM fields. By engaging with this rigorous course, our students are developing the skills and resilience needed to thrive in higher-level mathematical study and beyond.

Nineteen of our Year 11 students sat the challenging Further Maths exams this summer, and we hope they receive the results they've been working hard for when Results Day arrives on Thursday August 21st 2025.
